The Department of Planning and Sustainability primarily works to implement the <u>Tompkins</u> <u>County Comprehensive Plan</u> which presents a long-term vision for the future of the community. Specific considerations for natural resources (Part I) and agricultural resources (Part II) are identified in the <u>Tompkins County Conservation Plan</u>. This plan investigates the issues facing local agriculture and presents a coordinated, comprehensive approach to farmland protection by listing specific strategies to conserve critical agricultural land within the County's six designated Agricultural Resource Focus Areas (ARFAs). ARFAs are combined with *Locally Important Agricultural Areas* (designated by municipal comprehensive or farmland protection plans as areas of highest agricultural worth by local communities)

The <u>Tompkins County Environmental Management Council (EMC)</u> is an official citizen advisory board on local environmental issues (scope includes: to identify problems, propose priorities, and promote coordinated management and public discussion of natural resources).
