Babies First provides tangible help to babies, young children, and their families in need from all parts of Tompkins County by offering free baby equipment - gently used strollers, packn-plays, high chairs, baby seats, play centers, booster seats, potties, baby gates and more. They also offer new unused car seats in two sizes- infant and toddler. Referrals are received directly from individuals or from 18 plus non-profit public agencies throughout the county.

At Ithaca Area Collaborative Law Professionals, all negotiations take place in four-way conferences between parties and their attorneys. A safe and confidential environment is established so that each client can openly discuss and consider the needs of each other and the children. Families with limited financial resources may be able to access the Collaborative Law Process for free, subject to eligibility.

The ability to recover from difficult life, and often to be strengthened by and even transformed by those experiences. Social Connections Positive relationships that provide emotional, informational, instrumental and spiritual support.

CONCRETE SUPPORT

Access to concrete support and services that address a family's needs and help minimize stress caused by challenges.

KNOWLEDGE OF PARENTING AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Understanding child development and parenting strategies that support physical, cognitive, language, social and emotional development.

Social and Emotional competencies of Children Family and child interactions that help children develop the ability to communicate clearly, recognize and regulate their emotions and establish and maintain relationships
